Dear 5th Grade Families:

In preparation, please recognize that while culmination is an important time for our fifth graders, we must remember that this is but one of many promotions to come. The culmination is not a prom; it is not a graduation. It recognizes accomplishments as elementary school concludes and middle school begins. We are preparing our scholars for college and career readiness; this culmination needs to be placed within that frame of understanding and expectation.

With that, culmination is a recognition of accomplishments; to that end, our culmination ceremony will take place within Dorsey High School's auditorium on Thursday, June 6, 2019. **We are asking for students to arrive by 8:00 a.m.; we will start promptly at 9:00 a.m.** Please note that neither noisemakers, nor balloons are permitted in the auditorium. GIRLS

- * Dresses are to be of a youthful nature, no longer than tea length (mid calf) and no shorter than three inches above the knee.
- * Dresses may not be backless, strapless, halter, or with spaghetti straps.
- * Straps must be at least 1-1/2 inches wide.
- * Girls may also wear nice pants or dressy long shorts and an appropriate, nice top.
- * Tops and blouses must not expose midriff, underwear, or chest (cleavage).
- * Dress shoes may not have a heel higher than 2 inches.
- * Undergarments may not show at any time.

BOYS

- * Nice pants, slacks or dressy long shorts and a shirt with a collar.
- * Sweater or jacket optional
- * No tuxedos.
- * No jeans or T-shirts.
- * No sandals
- * Undergarments may not show at any time.
